An <b>assistant</b> works under the supervision of the provider and is not left in charge of children unless he or she meets all the qualifications of a substitute.							
A <b>substitute</b> is a person who is left in charge of children when the provider is absent and meets licensing or registration requirements. A substitute is a person who only works at the program when the provider is absent. If the staff member cares for children in the program both when the provider is present and when the provider is absent, he or she should be considered an assistant.
